

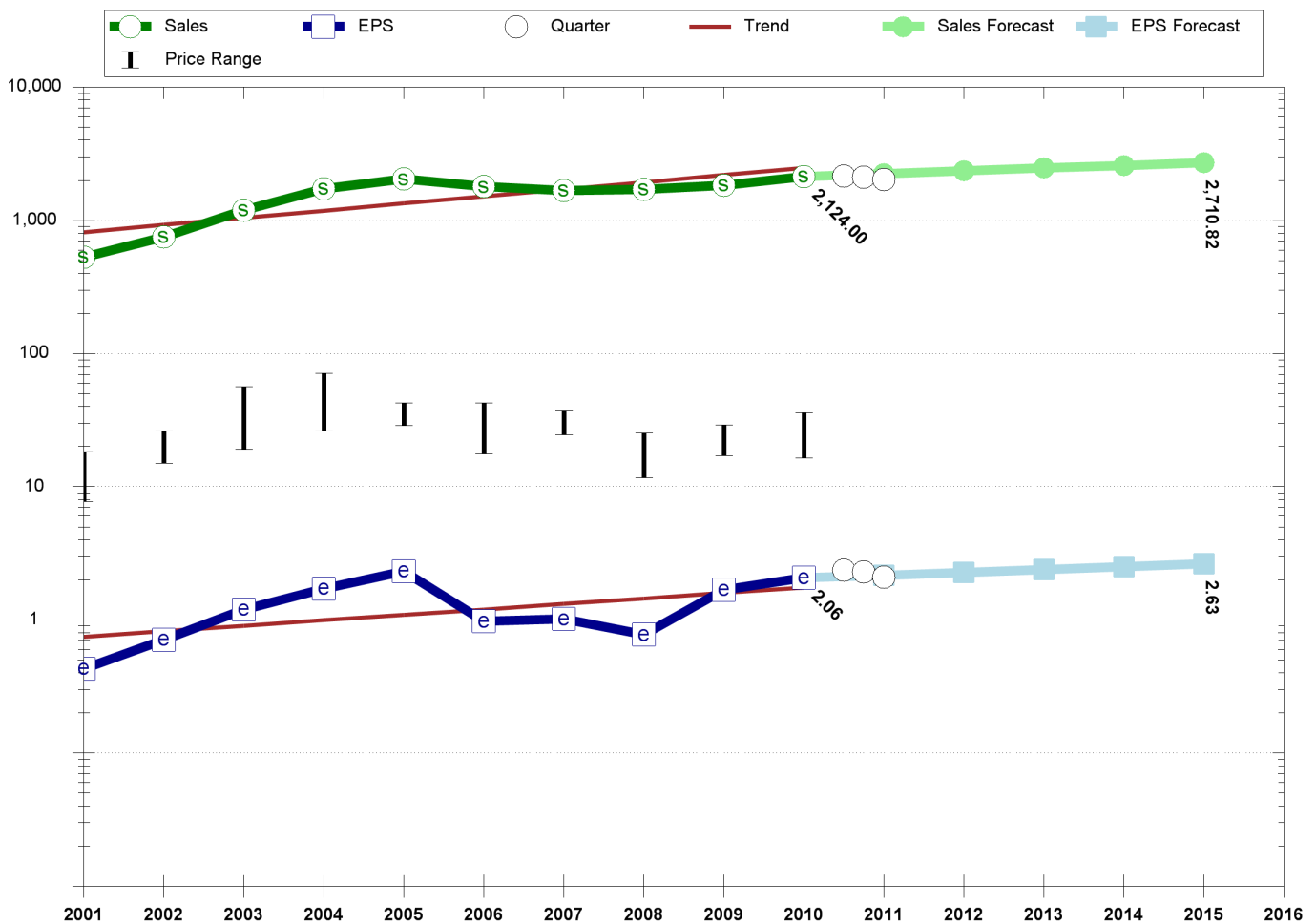

4 EVALUATING RISK and REWARD over the next 5 years

Assuming one recession and one business boom every 5 years, calculations are made of how high and how low the stock might sell. The upside-downside ratio is the key to evaluating risk and reward.

A HIGH PRICE - NEXT 5 YEARS

Avg. High P/E 15.00 X Estimate High Earnings/Share 2.63 = Forecasted High Price \$ 39.45

B LOW PRICE - NEXT 5 YEARS

(a) Avg. Low P/E 15.08 X Estimate Low Earnings/Share 2.06 = Forecasted Low Price \$ 31.06

(b) Avg. Low Price of Last 5 Years 17.39

(c) Recent Market Low Price 6.92

D UPSIDE DOWNSIDE RATIO (POTENTIAL GAIN VS. RISK OR LOSS)

$\frac{\text{High Price } 39.45 - \text{Minus Present Price } 7.69}{\text{Present Price } 7.69 - \text{Minus Low Price } 6.92} = \frac{31.76}{0.77} = 41.25$ To 1

E PRICE TARGET (Note: This shows the potential market price appreciation over the next five years in simple interest terms.)

$\frac{\text{High Price } 39.45}{\text{Present Market Price } 7.69} = 5.13 \times 100 = 513.00 - 100 = 413.00$ % Appreciation

5 5-YEAR POTENTIAL

This combines price appreciation with dividend yield to get an estimate of total return. It provides a standard for comparing income and growth stocks.
